No new games this time. Most lists needing one or two players. One more call for another 18EU player otherwise I will go for a start with four players.

Something that seems to be cropping up a lot recently is Twitter to the extent of it being the topic of being a leading article in The Times yesterday. Twitter is a web/mobile phone/other portable device facility that asks the question "What You Doing?" and allows 140 characters for each answer.

The recent spate of publicity started (for me at least) with a "subscriber" (it's free) answering the question with "<http://twitpic.com/135xa> - There's a plane in the Hudson. I'm on the ferry going to pick up the people. Crazy." The picture he posted (link in the message) showed the US Airways plane with passengers standing on the wing in the water and others getting into one of the rafts. 34 minutes later he was interviewed live on TV which says something that was only recently mind-boggling about the interconnectedness and achievable reaction time of modern communication.

On a more mundane level several papers have run snippets this week based on Twitters from "personalities". On Monday evening followers of Stephen Fry were kept updated on him being trapped in a lift somewhere near the 26th floor in Centre Point and were able to see pictures of him and fellow victims in said stuck lift. On Sunday you could be kept abreast of what Jonathan Ross and his house guest David Walliams thought of the TV show Dancing On Ice during their "slightly boring evening in".

It does amaze me just how often various "personalities" do Twitter. Stephen Fry is a classic and there are now over 150,000 people that are following him on Twitter (up from a mere 50,000 at the start of the year). Meaning that they choose to get his Twitters in their live feed. And he does update those followers frequently on what he is doing and thinking. And yes, he is witty, but even so, WTF? As I write Jonathan Ross (only 75,000 followers) has reported that he is leaving home to go to the Bafta Award Ceremony rehearsals. Why? Also these people do send a lot of messages to other people on Twitter, typically in reply to points and questions from "members of the public". So much more than MySpace or Facebook there is a direct link between the celebrity and the punter (is that the modern day equivalent of "The Prince And The Pauper"?). no doubt engendered by the fact that messages are limited to 140 characters and are essentially ephemeral in nature.

But as I was saying, it is the amount of time that these already prolific communicators spend on Twitter. Two other examples are Graham Linehan (Father Ted, The IT Crowd) and Neil Gaiman (so many books that should be read and more recently films). Actually quite interesting to see his (Neil G) thoughts/reactions on the process of attending/undergoing the whole hoo-ha media circus around the premiere of the latest film - Coraline - made from one of his books and how his daughter Maddy's perspective helped keep him balanced through the envelope.

It could be a mixture of the "if you want something done give it to a busy person" syndrome and that they are the type of people that feel the need to communicate in the first place. Maybe even the need to "spread the love" and/or some thinking that "you can't have enough publicity". But then, on a local level, why am I typing these words? All the publishers of amateur games zines, all those bloggers doing it for themselves and whoever might happen by, people who just love to write, want to express themselves, feel needed, validated ...

Meanwhile I know that the Power Monkey that Stephen Fry bought at Heathrow (along with a seriously dodgy man bag and two Paul Smith shirts) whilst waiting to fly to LA came in useful last night when there was a power cut over there that affected the house where he was staying as Hollywood and Downtown suffered multiple outages. I also know that the security gates had a manual override which was nice.
