- Tony O 1<sup>st</sup>** Thanks to all for an enjoyable game. Thanks also to Rob for running it so well.
- As always with 1829, you never know what will happen, and this game seemed to be very unusual, with the Midland failing to be its normal powerhouse (partially my fault).
- Thanks to Mike R for his co-operation, and for pushing me all the way. I made 2 or 3 tactical mistakes in the game, but got slightly lucky in the big SDR. This set me up for the rest of the game, although I found that my combination of companies weren't ideally suited to each other. Thanks also to Andy, David and Mike B for fighting it out to the end, with Andy edging ahead in the final run-in.
- Mike R 2<sup>nd</sup>** Playing 1829 with Tony is like playing football against Germany - you wait all game for a mistake that never comes while he turns every sniff of a chance into goals. Mind you, I have nobody but myself to blame, as only inadequately conditional orders denied me the directorship of the GER and a chance to compete. You'd think most of a page of conditional buys and sells would be sufficient - but no - when will I ever learn? (No, don't bother to answer that, I fear it's "never") Heh ho - once the damage was done I was reasonably pleased to stay close, but I was only ever playing for second, which we all know in our hearts may as well be last. So, once again its congratulations to Tony, and thanks to Rob for running the game, and hope for better in B38.
- Andy M 3<sup>rd</sup>** It was a game of two leagues and I guess I was top of division two.
- David H 4<sup>th</sup>** When my local group started playing 1829 back in 1978, the saying was that the player who owned the most shares of the first three companies would likely be the winner. I thoroughly disproved it this game. Congratulations to Tony for the win and thanks to Rob for running it.
- Mike B 5<sup>th</sup>** Congratulations to Tony and thanks to Rob for his adjudication. By the time I adjusted to the unusual (by current standards) tile set and rules for starting a company, it was too late for me to do much but enjoy the ride. I will try this again in the future; however, I'm not sure I would do much better because I tend to write orders using the KISS principal, and this game (at least by zine) appears to require voluminous orders at times to account for all the permutations (especially in Stock Dealing Rounds).
- GM** As evinced by Mike B's comments, aspects of 1829 are a "shock" to those raised on pretty much all other (he said, hedging his bets in the face of not knowing all the other) 18xx titles. I like the survey parties as an extra puzzle factor. But I think most, if not all, would agree that the *bête noire* is the one company available at a time - although the manoeuvring around the last new share of a company can be fascinating. In a recent podcast Bruce Shelley did comment that 1830 as first presented to Avalon Hill by Francis Tresham also had one company available at a time. Bruce found this restrictive and related that it was his suggestion/request (amongst his other developmental effort) to make the change to have all companies immediately available.
- All of the above ramble is leading up to a big thank you to Mike B for sticking with the game once its tropes had revealed themselves to his disadvantage. We had the opposite problem when Francis first showed us 1830 and we tried to play it like it was 1829. In the innocent days of Minstrel we did wonder whether 1830 could actually be played by post.
- Having highlighted the "difficulties" of 1829 - and the oft regarded as fickle fate aspect of the one company at a time thing - it is necessary to point out that Tony O has played 17 "postal" games of 1829 and has won 16 of them. So skill and attention will out. The only person to ever beat Tony O at postal 1829 is Jeff Edmunds.
- In other news Jeff would no doubt agree that David H was obviously dragging his feet in not getting to 1829 until 1978. I guess he did have the disadvantage of living further away from Francis but even so - get a grip! Although this does make me wonder about the spread of 18xx - did Hartland Trefoil distribute 1829 to the US? I did presume that it was the publication of 1830 that really started the spread of 18xxism. Discuss.

The WGB joins the fray in time for the last set of ORs. I have asked for ORs to end the game but please advise (soonest) if you want fewer next time. Also, end game comments will be welcomed and looked after.
