

The 18xx games are in order of starting from p3. RR2362EA is on p8, Outpost M16 ends on p9. Puerto Rico M1 is on p10 & P11. The Games That You Play is on p11.

New Games: A new Outpost starts on p2 - still time for anybody interested to join. There were no new waiting list applications for 18xx so I will give that another month before thinking to start a new game.

Last year I did not mention the revived UK Zine Poll until after the results had been announced. I can't remember whether I voted - probably not. Crumbs, there's a ringing endorsement then. Anyway, this time you do get the details as provided by Alex Rishardson which are ...

a) WHO MAY VOTE? Anyone who reads at least two eligible zines.

b) WHICH ZINES ARE ELIGIBLE? Any zine published in the British Isles which has produced an issue in 2019 (up to and including the Poll deadline), is distributed by post, as an e-mail, as an attachment to an e-mail or as a download from a website, and runs games that we would recognise as 'postal' ones (e.g. Diplomacy, Railway Rivals, 18xx, En Garde! or By Popular Demand, among many others). I shall also accept votes for *Outbreak of Heresy* and *Where Is My Mind?* (N.B. The zines should be UK ones but the voters can come from anywhere -- all that matters is that you are a regular reader.)

c) HOW TO VOTE. List all the eligible zines that you see and give each one a mark between 1.0 (low) and 10.0 (high), to one decimal place if you like. Editors are allowed to vote for their own zines. Votes should be sent by e-mail from the voter's own account to alex.bokmal at googlemail.com. The Poll deadline will be midnight on THURSDAY 31ST OCTOBER 2019. Results will be sent by e-mail to each voter and (I hope) published by a zine editor near you.

By my reckoning, the following zines are eligible this time around: *The Cunning Plan*, *Dane's Games*, *Devolution*, *Fury of the Northmen*, *Gesundheit*, *Hopscotch*, *...mais n'est-ce pas la gare?*, *Minstrel*, *Obsidian*, *Ode*, *Outbreak of Heresy*, *Quartz**, *The Tangerine Terror**, *To Win Just Once*, *Variable Pig* and *Where Is My Mind?* (**Quartz* and *TTT* will be included if they produce an issue before the Poll deadline.)

Yes, this is a begging letter. In my defence I don't often ask for money for doing daft things for charity, but this October, Val, Melodie, and I are taking part in a sponsored "Crowd Climb" to the top of Mount Longonot - a 9.000 ft extinct volcano (we really hope it's extinct) in Kenya's Great Rift Valley to raise funds for Footsteps International. This is a small charity, run by some friends of ours, which provides a home and schooling for orphans and rescued street-kids in Kenya - about 140 of the boys will be the "crowd" climbing with us. Colonist placements or removals will be marked by "+" or "-" after the relevant building or plantation NAME.

John is the Builder John +Small Market [0], Tony +Small Indigo Plant [-1], David +Small Market [-1], Mike +Hospice [-4], Brad +Hacienda [-2].
Tony is a Prospector Tony [+1].
David is the Mayor David Corn+ Small Market+, Mike Corn+, Brad Hacienda+, John Small Market+, Tony Corn+.
Mike is the Craftsman Mike +Corn, Tony +Corn, David +Corn, Mike +Corn.
