The building allowance for each of rounds 1-6 will be derived from three die rolls in the range 3 to 6 with no one round ever having more than one roll of 3 (but see the intro above for a potential change). The building allowance in round 7 will be 12 points (plus payments to rivals) and will then decrease by 2 for each subsequent round.

Some ducking and diving (whatever that means) as the colony cards are auctioned. And now ... a reminder to state your bid values as the value before any applicable discounts. If I see "bid to V (-D for discounts)" I wonder if the bit in brackets is there to remind me or is a modifier of the bid value V.
