- Mike R Well hurrah for me. I'm always open to some co-operative network building and John and I were able to develop a mutually delightful PRR/C&O network. Unfortunately (for Mike B) that meant being seriously unkind to the B&O for pretty much the whole game, so I'm sorry about that - it was nothing personal! There was also a concern that said delightful network might prove rather too delightful for the PRR, and there were a couple of points in the middle to late game where I thought John would probably overtake me; first when the CPR based out E19 robbing the ERR of an early run to New York, and then again when the PRR secured the first diesel. Hindsight suggests John had just a little too much ground to make up, but it didn't feel like it at the time, and I was (as usual) far too lazy to do the maths to give me the comfort of a robust forecast. \$200 in \$10,000 at the end is almost nothing at all, so hats off to John for very nearly pulling it off. Commiserations to Tony and Mike B and thank you for staying the course long after your hopes were dust.
- John S Congratulations to Mike on his win, until the last SR I had hopes that I could catch him, but then the PRR price stalled as it hit the top right spot and I ran out of a useful source of increased value. I found this a very interesting game with many plots and sub-plots to keep my brain active. Thanks to all for playing and to Rob for adjudicating.
- Mike B Congratulations to Mike Ruffhead and thanks to Rob. To finish as close as I did to third is probably a minor miracle. Especially since the PRR and C&O seemed to be going out of their way with unusual tile lays to keep the B&O from breaking out (or maybe their owners were just bored). It may be time (or possibly past time) to consider doing the private auctions in this game and others via email. (I had a game of 18GL in another 'zine where we did the private auction (with more privates) and the initial stock round in three weeks), or at the very least limit bids to those divisible by 5. It is hard enough trying to figure out how much someone is going to overpay for the C&A without the complication of guessing the end digit.
- GM I will offer Mike's suggestion of handling the sales of privates by email in future games. It reminds me that - way back when - we hesitated to play 1830 by post, wondering whether it could be done. Splitting the first SR into the sale of the privates and then the remainder of the SR was a trial that worked. Then when it came to 18EU et al email was commonplace and we thought to handle the initial dealing that way. So we can update our thinking on the start of 1830. Spreading the effort across a few emails is worthwhile to make sure that the start is free of unwelcome surprises.
