

This issue delayed by this space that needed to be filled. Instead of doing that I spent a chunk of the seasonal break making significant progress on a new version of my adjudicator. It's been brewing slowly as an exercise in me getting used to Microsoft's .NET Framework – partially a “because it's there” thing plus it keeps up with the times. The new version does have “nice” minor improvements over my current program – like it knows which tile and hex combinations have only one orientation, it knows when a survey party is following another, can handle compass orientations and more conveniences like that. Mainly I hope it will prove to be more flexible and able to cope more readily with new game types (hence my comment last time on 1870 & 1850). But it needs to understand 1835 first.

A valuable help will be the 18xx Rules Difference List maintained exhaustively by my brother at [http://www.fwtwr.com/18xx/rules\\_difference\\_list/index.htm](http://www.fwtwr.com/18xx/rules_difference_list/index.htm). When I was at his place over Christmas his collection of 18xx games demonstrated in a quite physical manner just how many 18xx games there are out there than can be bought (and presumably many others exist in private form only).

Around the goose we played Alhambra, The Gardens of Alhambra and Big Kini. Some of this was research for possible For Whom The Web Rocks (<http://www.fwtwr.com/>) games. With that in mind we also looked at Das Zepter von Zanador. Keith's level of organisation & ability to complete is frightening.

Issue 23 of Games International is just available to buy in pdf version (\$2.99 single issue) from Board Game Geek (<http://www.boardgamegeek.com/premium.php3>). Railroad Tycoon (the board game) has a “special preview” and the opening line is of course “It all started with 1829 ...” (Francis Tresham taught the band to play). Along the way Martin Wallace says “I've played a few games of the 18xx series but they are too difficult to get into, not intuitive to play, and go on too long.” The whole preview (two pages) can be read (for free) at <http://www.boardgamegeek.com/free/issue23/GI-Article23.pdf>. The fact that it's only a Railroad Tycoon preview (to be reviewed in Issue 24) seems to emphasise the lag effect of Games International. We've already had Mike R tell us in the quarterly Counter that for this game the most important question is “Do I have a big enough table” (“but you just got to love those bits”).

Meanwhile it has been a busy start to the year at work and it's quite handy that the deadline got pushed back by the delay to this issue as I'll have to go to Amsterdam for a few days in each of the next three weeks. Before the first trip there's time for the annualish arrival of David Roffey from Sydney to cause a few of us to get together. And there are new series of Shameless & The O.C. to see – or quite possibly tape and never get round to watching so end up getting the DVD set when sold cheaply. The West Wing Season 6 is continuing so that is first choice as I have managed to watch it to date.

I see that Ian Livingstone has just been awarded an OBE. Not sure if that's for services to UK gamers or for some other endeavour. Some of you will know Ian, but for others he and Steve Jackson were the founders of Games Workshop, both spending six months virtually living in a van until the role playing thing gained sufficient commercial traction. Ian edited Owl and Weasel in the latter 70s – one of the first games zines that had me as a subscriber. He and Steve developed Games Workshop, started White Dwarf (I wrote a review for the first issue) and later they wrote the Fighting Fantasy books (15 million sold). They eventually sold out for some millions each.

Ian played golf in Spain for 18 months before getting terminally bored and returning to the UK to use his money to buy into Eidos via Domark. Last time I saw him was around that time in Just Games. As the Eidos published Lara Croft computer games deteriorated he lost his top position at Eidos (his unsuccessful Beach Tycoon game may have helped) but when they were taken over by SCi he was the only Eidos boss to be retained. And there he was in the Times promoting and predicting a forthcoming resurgence for Lara Croft and billed as “the self-appointed guardian of the cyberbabe”.

On a related note, the current Games Workshop Chairman & Chief Executive – Tom Kirby – used to be a Minstrel recipient. He did get in touch a few years back saying he wanted to play some 18xx again but I didn't hear again after that. Tom is Visiting Professor of Business and Management to the Derbyshire Business School at the University of Derby and a member of the Warhammer Pension Scheme. His total emoluments in 2004 were £1.7m (only £0.4m in 2005) so all that takes time. I hope.
