Mike Ruffhead Further to the unprecedented illustration in 294 (1861) - I had the chance to play the published version at the w/e - it's very good, and better than my memory of the pre-production version. There's lots of potential variety in the way the Minor companies can combine and interact and it has a rapid acceleration to a close from the mid-game that guarantees a finish inside four hours (unless your group is really, *really*, slow). This could be the best of the recent 18XX releases - it's certainly well up with EU and I'd play this ahead of 56 or 44 for example.

Also got to play a prototype of a new Outpost-style game - theme is an ancient civilisation rather than a space colony but otherwise the system is very similar, and it's excellent. It's called Phoenicia, plays in under 90 minutes, is out next year from JKLM and Rio Grande. Recommended.

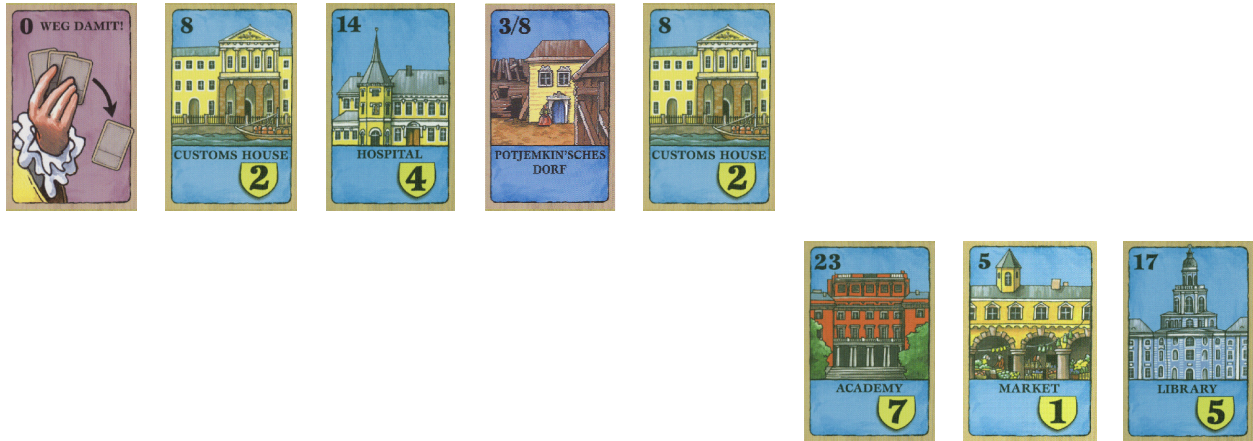
