I've mentioned www.pandora.com before - it's an internet music station that will stream music at you that you might well like based on the bands or tracks that you seed it with. It uses the Music Genome Project http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Music_Genome_Project to do that. In mid- January it was forced to stop streaming to anybody outside the US, or rather, anybody who appeared from their IP address to be listening from outside the US. This was due to a licensing issue. But if you had an account, or want to create one, and you want to listen then you can do it through www.globalpandora.com.

There are other sites, notably www.last.fm, that will do a similar job. But not as well in my experience. Last.fm is now owned by CBS and they probably have more emphasis on direct marketing than is apparent. Last.fm will also tabulate the music you play on it or on your own PC so I do let it do that and it has tracked 6,000+ plays. My top artist with 282 plays is The Wallflowers (Jakob Dylan's band) and my top track with 24 plays is Heartbreak To Hate by Angelfish (Shirley Manson's pre-Garbage band). If you really need to know more about my top ten artists and tracks you can check out fuller results in my Facebook profile.

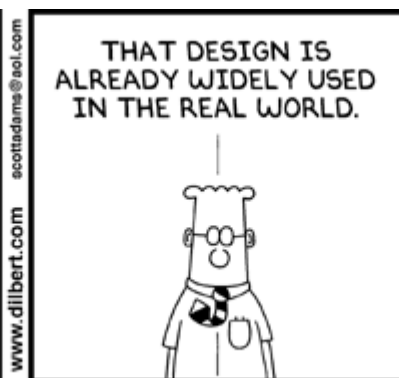
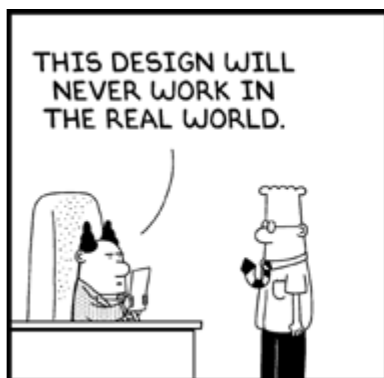
