Trumpeter - Louis Armstrong 17, Dizzy Gillespie 3, Eddie Calvert 1, Wynton Marsalis 1, Miles Davis 1. The most apparently open category we have had but one clear winner. Miles Davis made the best selling jazz album of all time, Wynton Marsalis & Dizzy Gillespie are indisputably "trumpeters of repute" and Eddie "O Mein Papa" Calvert was the first British instrumentalist to achieve two number one records but the popular answer was always going to be Louis Armstrong.

English Motorway - M1 13, M25 8, M6 1, M6 Preston Bypass 1. As Tim pointed out, "M1" is the name of this game and I thought it would win by a greater margin with M25 as the other possible choice. Special thanks to Gina for making me snort (in a good way) whilst David S shows loyalty to his local motorway.

Mozart Opera - Magic Flute 12, Marriage of Figaro 9, Abduction from the Seraglio 1, Don Juan 1. I'm not an opera buff and I think the two highest scoring operas are the ones that most "people in the street and not in the opera houses" will know. But, as a random alleged fact, Don Giovanni (Don Juan) is the 8<sup>th</sup> most performed opera in the US, just behind The Marriage of Figaro and a few places ahead of The Magic Flute. Mozart's other entry to that top 20 list is Cosi Fan Tutte. Use that information wisely.

Continent - Asia 13, Africa 5, North America 4, America 1. Asia is the biggest and I guess that's why it's the most popular. Dane had a nasty suspicion that he would regret choosing Africa over America, but not so.

#### Comments

**Mike** Well, now, I think that shiny new type 7 in the GCR means Jeff will be closing on me by about £100 a round. However I also think the bank will go bust in two ORs which means I should cling on for victory. If it goes to 3 ORs I might not hold out. Anyway, I can't see anything I can do to influence events now, so I've just gotta cross my fingers and hope. John might play kingmaker with unhelpful garrisons, but he could have done it long before now, and being John, I very much doubt he will. Good game this.

**Jeff** Well I think I catch up a bit but still come second. If I'd had 720 not 710 and bought the 7 train one round earlier I'd have sneaked it. Mind you JS could play havoc with all his garrison money.

**Tony** It is very difficult to win 1829 without a directorship in one of the first three companies. I was never able to buy a 4 train for the GNR at the correct time.

**John** I can't see anything to improve from my last place so I think my companies will just retreat to a safe hole and run & pay.

**GM** Yup, one more OR and Jeff would have won, even without basing London with the GCR to reduce the SECR run. The bank needed to have £750 more for there to be one more OR.

A good game ending with a very well developed network and a great 5 train London to Liverpool route. I don't remember anyone earning over 1,000 in a single 1829 round before. Even so Wales is still of no interest to either the engineers or the financiers and East Anglia does not fare much better.

Apropos of Tony's comment - Mike & Jeff did indeed start with the LNWR & GWR, respectively. But they had the same companies at the start of H18 and David Smith won that game (Neil Walters was the first Midland director). So, you can win without running any of the first three companies, but I do know that I would always prefer to have one (or more!) of them. Plus David is a rather accomplished player.

All players in this game played their part to make it a good and interesting game so my thanks to all and especially congratulations to Mike (with his 29<sup>th</sup> recorded victory from 63 completed games) and commiserations to Jeff (who has 14 wins from his 22 completed and recorded postal games).
