Well, short of time as usual. But that's only because I have been doing other things - but I do seem to drag myself away long enough to push this out the door before it really is too late. The deadline is a bit shorter this time than usual (although of course I do already have some orders for next time as the 18xx reports have been on the web site for at least a week). But another week pushes it too far towards Christmas.

MidCon has been and gone - and once again I did not play any 18xx. In fact, whilst the thought of playing against the assembled talent is both exciting and daunting, the thought of playing against that level of knowledge of the games that I do not know is just unappealing. Unless I were to adopt the longer term thinking exhibited by Jeff some (I don't know - 10?) years ago who decided that the weekend would be devoted to learning Outpost properly - so many games played with no doubt increasing understanding and also increasing success. Also, for me, MidCon is as much a social event as a gaming event.

But games were played. For the second weekend in a row it was Le Havre and Dominion as the new games from Essen. Le Havre made more sense the second time and everything fell into place so that I bought two Luxury Liners in the last 5 turns to take the game from Markus W who had been playing and leading steadily throughout and was fully, and with some reason, expecting the win.

Dominion is that card game that we all could have developed in theory. It's mostly about playing solitaire in company, but the fast pace (once you grasp the mechanics of what goes where when) and social banter make it a very enjoyable pastime. Chris Dawe reported that one 2 player game took 8 minutes on Brett Spiel Welt and he has already played 70 or 700 games online there. Then again the knowledge of the possible cards that can be used will be an advantage - we played two games at MidCon and Chris and Keith Rapley each took a first and a second place whilst John Harrington & I each took a third and a fourth place. It's possible that skill was also a relevant factor but I thought about that and discarded it as an explanation.

Oh, just noticed that I did not complete the scoring table last time. Sorry 'bout that. Meanwhile John queried the payments last time and this lead to an unfortunate discovery. The GRIB payment of 7 to FRITES for U31 to Ixelles is correct. But in Round 5 GRIB ordered C28-Elsene (and I can see how the "O" on the map becomes a "C" when a railway line is drawn through the hex). But I reported O33-Elsene and that was faithfully reproduced on the map provided by David. So VROOM built most of the same route in all innocence.

I offered Brad the choice of leaving the build in place - with no payments to GRIB - or of making an alternative build. He kindly went for the "easier for both of us" option of leaving the build in place. It was not used in Run 7 as Brad did not expect (and would not have expected) there to be a connection between O28 & P28.

This time GBP & GRIB team up for a couple of uncontested runs so both gain ground, notably GBP who is up there with FRITES in the lead. But are they winning?
