The players in this game are the eight that were on the waiting list - John Webley, David Hooton, Mark Stretch, Dane Maslen, Ian Pendlebury, Jeff Edmunds, Mike Ruffhead, Lyndon Gurr - plus anybody who sends orders or an "accept automated start" (see below) message. Each player will start the game with average cards - namely four 3 Ore and two 7 Water.

Ian P has suggested an automated first two rounds whereby players automatically buy a Water factory on the first turn and the second turn purchase is made dependent upon the cards you receive in the first round. The details of Ian's proposals are enclosed in the Minstrel 318 mailing.

Please decide whether you like this automated start, which saves some thinking. If so - the only action needed for the next deadline is confirmation that you are playing. If you don't want the automated start then please send me orders for how you want to handle rounds 1 & 2. In either case Minstrel 319 will report your cards after Round 2 and request orders for Round 3.

Then the MsE and OIE are both available once all the WtE, BaE & HeE have been bought. The PrE shares are available once at least one share in one of the WtE, BaE & HeE has been bought. Or (3) Full Thompson - as the Half Thompson but the MsE & WtE are available at the same time as the WtE, BaE & HeE. The PrE shares are available once at least one share in one of the WtE, BaE, HeE, MsE & OIE has been bought.
