A novel by Raymond Chandler : The Big Sleep 17, The Long Goodbye 1, Farewell My Lovely 1.

The Bogart & Bacall film helped to cement The Big Sleep - the first of Chandler's novels - as the best known. Built up from previous short stories Chandler was asked by director Howard Hawks who killed the chauffeur and replied that he didn't know thus epitomising his Dashiell Hammett influenced removal of murder from the drawing room to the mean streets where all is not so logically simple and tidy. My personal favourite is the Long Goodbye and Farewell My Lovely is the third of his best regarded novels.

A Rolling Stone - other than Jagger and Richards : Bill Wyman 8, Charlie Watts 8, Ronnie Wood 3.

I think it had to be one of the originals who lasted longer than Brian Jones and certainly Ian Stewart. Then a toss up between Watts and Wyman, maybe Watts due to still being there and after all "Charlie's good tonight i'n't he?" But Wyman has more notoriety. Wood is more prominent now but he only joined in 1975 so a late comer. As an aside - his band The Birds were a treat when I was at school.

A Richard Wagner Opera - other than from the Ring Cycle : The Flying Dutchman 7, Tristan and Isolde 5, Tannhauser 3, Lohengrin 2, The Valkyrie 1, Parsifal 1.

How do you choose here? By personal preference (if one has one) or by general awareness? Your top four choices are arguably his most acclaimed outside The Ring Cycle so probably a combination of the two.

A US state where same-sex marriages are, or will be, legal before the end of 2009 : Massachusetts 6, California 6, Vermont 5, Iowa 1, Maine 1.

Massachusetts was the first US state to recognise same-sex marriages and has been joined by Connecticut & Iowa. By the end of 2009 Vermont and Maine will join the list for sure hence my phrasing of the question which anticipated a split between Massachusetts & Vermont. But the current publicity around the debate in California no doubt resulted in that being the third of the popular choices.

A UK Cabinet member whose first or second name starts with "H" [Laboured Question Award] : Harriet Harman 14, Hazel Blears 2, Geoff Hoon 1, John Hutton 1, Hilary Benn 1.

This question was prompted by Hazel Blears annoying me before and during the expenses row here in the UK. But that gave no basis the general population (in the UK let alone outside) to make a choice. The reason I actually set the category was the double H-ness of Harriet Harman - which does seem to have "worked" and she was the second most popular answer of the round, making this surprisingly the second least random category. Of course many claimed double points for her in hope rather than expectation.

I also had a difficult choice when some co-operation plans were offered. Judging by my position I guess I made the right move that time. Congrats to Tony... one day.. one day.. or am I just dreaming? Thanks to all players and GM.

Mike Well then, it's hats off to Tony again - a careful win grounded in his early strike for the MR and cemented by the ever-lovely combination with the GNR. As for me, I will be a resounding third - and frankly I deserved no more.
