Tim My thanks to you, Rob, for another excellent job. It is very much appreciated by all of us. In this game I think I benefitted from couple of things. First was the close cooperation with Graham, giving our early companies a boost in share dealing and track laying, but more telling, after my slow start, was the unexpected opportunity to snap up two 3-trains. This allowed me first to catch up, and then accelerate by buying two 5-trains. With my trains all running through Toronto, it made it very hard for the other players to slow me down.

Graham Well played by Tim. One key moment for him was running for credits to buy a 5 train for a forthcoming company.

Ian I would like to thank Rob for the substantial time and effort he has spent moderating this game. Congratulations to Tim for his excellent win. Sadly, his extra share meant that this victory had been certain for some time.

My first reaction is relief that F26 has now finished. As soon as all of the companies had been floated, the game became a tracking laying slog until the Bank eventually ran out of cash. The interesting part of the game arrived much earlier. Tim and Graham had produced a very efficient track laying operation in the East, whereas Ian and Tony had failed to communicate resulting in disjoint track laying. Unfortunately, David's position crumbled on the purchase of the first 4-train. Since Ian and Tony were heading for very miserable third and fourth positions, a train purchasing plan was devised to improve this situation. This plan worked reasonably well, but the final garrison in the game prevented Ian and Tony from finishing ahead of Graham.

David Congratulations to Tim for the win. By going first in OR3 and last in OR4 (three players sold a share in the intervening SR), my WR lost its chance to buy 3-trains, and it was all downhill from there.

GM Words

The bottom two at the end of round 9 are in the top three earners this time - but so is the leader from round 9 and there is still a 70 point gap from first to last.

TANG, with the longest route, made a great start in Run 15 but could not sustain it and was just pipped to third place by HOI-SIN with GRINCH the winner. This pattern was repeated in Run 16 with longest runner CSR starting string and fading to last place; GITCO comfortably beat the equally lengthed YAYS with his only entry of the round. GRINCH made up the numbers in Run 17 but was rewarded for the effort. CSR tried gain with the longest route (just) in Run 18 and was victorious with the (just) shortest route of GRINCH gaining second place. TANG cruised as the solo entrant for Run 19.
