Comments

- Tony** Thanks to all for the closest 1829 I have ever played, not only the winning margin, but also the spread from 1st to 5th - I've never known anyone win a game with less than 22%. For me, the game was a story of two ORs. In the first, John managed to acquire 3 of the remaining 4 companies, skilfully controlling the game from then onwards. But, in the penultimate OR, he made some errors, leaving the door ajar for me to (hopefully) squeeze through. Well done to Mike for making the most of his single company. Bad luck to David and Andy, who were gaining at the end, but ran out of time. Andy was also unlucky that I was forced to change my poorly thought-out plans, bankrupting the L&YR in which he had invested. Thanks, as always, to Rob for a well run game.
- Mike** Sometimes you get lucky in the big share rounds, and sometimes you don't - no matter how carefully the orders are written. With just the one company I was lucky to finish third - and wouldn't have managed that without the generous train deal with John. Hats off to Tony and John.
- Andy** When the L&YR collapsed, I knew my fate was sealed but this has to have been the closest fought game I've been in, only about 4% between 1st and last place. Thanks to all who participated and to the GM for the smooth running. I guess it's congrats to Tony again as he slides up on the outside.
- GM** Yes - a lovely close spread across all players. All players ordered carefully and thoughtfully for the later "crucial SDR" but the way it worked out John was blessed with a trio of companies and went on the out in front. But Tony kept thinking and took the opportunities to regain the lead in time to win. But although important it isn't just about the one SDR - everybody worked on the game throughout and that was what led to the closeness of the grouping given the length of the game. Thanks to all for that. I like 1829 even though you are (more than in many other 18xx titles) subject to fortune's fickle finger at times ...

The CA bases alongside the TGB in K8 to reduce many dividends but David still earns the most. The bank could likely remain unbroken at the end of OR17 so we could be running right through to OR20 ...

The SxE dividend breaks the bank and the game is over. John W retained with the PrE but that still took money out of the bank - but did not change the finishing order. Don was catching up on Tony (and would have done so until the ByE hit the top value) and John W (especially) and David would also have gained on those ahead but that's not important now ... the game is over and Tony has won!

Any game end comments will be published next time. One reminder now from me - a quirk of 1835 is that the 14 & 15 tiles do not promote as they do in many (all?) other 18xx titles where they are extant.

Against his expectations, Mike does not go bankrupt. Along the way he does give NYNH \$31 towards its purchase of a 6 train from the Erie, and later makes the following sales to fund a diesel for the Erie - PRR/3(228), B&O(67), C&O(140), B&M(71), NYNH/5(325) - which gives him exactly \$1,100 and also causes the NYNH presidency to transfer to Tony S. That leaves only the CPR without a train and Tony S has cash enough to keep it afloat so next time I am asking to go through to SR8. Mike is no doubt delighted.

Meanwhile the CGR had been formed with 10% shares - a not so usual occurrence. But that's not important now as John runs out as the winner of this curtailed game ...
