GRaB turned a slight route length advantage in run 15 into a storming victory with D'MARK just edging BEST for second place. GITCO strolled run 16 solo and then the tradition continued of benevolence for D'MARK (added to the fundamental skill) as Mike won the crap shoot that was run 17. But even D'MARK could not make good with the route disadvantage of run 18 and GCR & BEST took the honours. Run 19 was a solo entry for GCR and then Tony won run 20 against equally gifted (lengthwise) opposition. GRID wanted to pay 12 (actually 13) to GCR and I thought this not allowed (limit if payments of 10). But I have published no rules for this game and the 11<sup>th</sup> Edition Postal Rules that I do have do not include this restriction. So I had to let it happen - and GRID squeaked second place from GRaB. Finally, GRID overtook BEST to win run 21.

GCR challenges GITCO for second place and GRID maintains a distinctive position. This game seems to have completely right for D'MARK and completely wrong for GRID. Unusual distribution.
