The CGR is formed with two defaults applied for Ian quite probably/hopefully just as he expected ... (1) The BBG could have been kept out of the CGR and in the absence of an instruction the default for companies without a permanent train of "no" was applied, and (2) as the new CGR president he did not say whether he wanted to keep the available 4 trains and the default applied here was "yes". Meanwhile, the THB home base is on the station that connects to L13 and the THB could not buy a train from the bank because it did not have enough cash and did not have a route to allow presidential assistance.

Right, last time I omitted to include the points from runs 8 & 15 in the new scores so BRASS & GITCO have 20 more than stated. Further, BRASS & GRID should have got 15 (not 10) points each for their joint victory in run 19. Furthermore, although I only gave BRASS 10 in the run 19 results, I actually gave him 20 in the scoring summary. So overall that flushes out as net changes of +15 for BRASS, +20 for GITCO and +5 for GRID. That's quite a lot of senior moments for one adjudication - I wonder what the collective noun is? A vaguary of senior moments? Anyway, let's try getting this round done right. People.

This time GITCO kicks off this time with a solo win and then BRASS & BMX perform to form in run 23. BRASS was actually over the line way before BMX but there are no extra points for grandstanding. Run 24 was a triple dead heat with only the longest route of BMX not returning any points other than payments. BMX did have the equal shortest route in the lottery that was run 25 but again placed beyond the points. GITCO & GRID were neck and neck, ahead of the lightly route advantaged BLOT, until the last hurrah when GRID found a little extra and took the win. GITCO declared a Joint Run with 4Lions for run 27 but gave a route clearly based on running with BRASS, who did order exactly the same route as a Joint Run with GITCO. So I let it happen and they won unopposed and they share the 20 points for first place. BRASS was the back in storming mode for run 28 with GRID placing second.

And all of that puts GRID just ahead of 4Lions with GITCO and BRASS consolidating ahead of BLOT & BMX. Well, unless there are errors, but I have done some checking and some things are clearly correct.

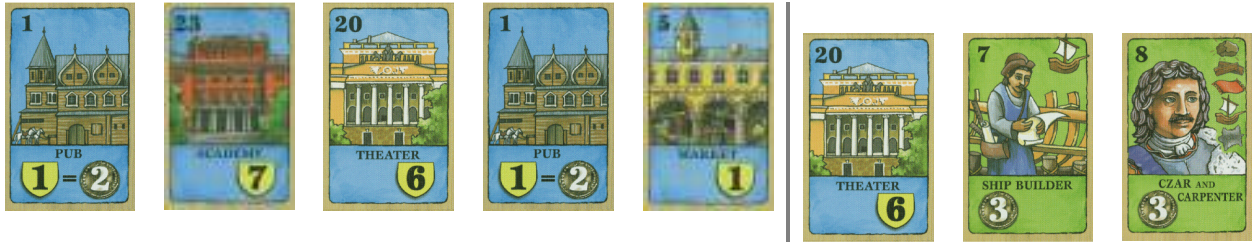
