Ian P - 1st

I would like to thank Rob for the substantial time and effort he has spent moderating this game.

This game became very interesting when Tim & George started to act as a partnership. Efficient credit manipulation meant that the CV (George) ended up with the last two 5-trains. Clearly, Tim-George would run away with the game unless some significant actions could be taken. It was fairly obvious that the CV & THB would have massive runs in the East unless the CPR could be saved. Ian and Graham decided to use their thousand plus credits from their new companies to keep their old companies. The old companies had good trains and good routes, but substantial debts. Stock Round 5 saw a massive amount of share price manipulation.

(Note. Ian & Graham invited David to join in with this project. In an early part of the game, David's position had crumbled with the purchase of the first 4-train. Although Ian applied an unreasonable level of sticks and carrots, David stuck to his principles and kept his original game plan. David did exceptionally well to avoid finishing last.)

A minor problem with SR5 meant that the WR had to be retired by crashing its share price in a later SR. At one stage, I thought that Toronto would never be upgraded to a grey tile, since this upgrade appeared to suit nobody. I was fortunate to win this game by a narrow margin from Graham.
