New Games: None. There really should be one or more next time.

Sometimes you just want a pause between rounds. It is always helpful to other players if you can let them (directly or via me) as soon as possible if you do want fewer rounds than I have asked for. Conditional pauses are sometimes tricky as you might not want to even admit the possibility in case it highlights the reason for your nervousness. But you get the point - advise whenever possible and advise as early as possible.

Tim Parkes - 1st

Many thanks to you, Rob, for running this game. I think that a three player game works well for 1835. Each player will have one of ByE, SxE and PrE. It is very hard to win if you have none of these. A four player game can also work well if the fourth player gets two of HeE, BaE and WtE, and can attack the share price of ByE and SxE, but this will need some good timing and probably some good luck as well. 1835M35 was one of those games where one player gets a big lead, but another player is finishing faster. With a close finish in sight, Graham lost out at the end due to misjudging the timing of the train purchases. It was a hard fought game.

Congratulations to Tim. Both he and George kept putting in the effort, even when the result seemed clear. I can't explain why I wrongly sold that train at the end! However thanks to Rob for running smoothly as usual.

In my opinion, the 3 player format is a good one, since every player gets a chance to seize a Directorship. Considering the 'processional' nature of 1835 companies coming out slowly, the early rounds with more players can be boring for some.
