The Receiver perceives that the LNWR has more trains than it can run and will move its SP to G6 hoping to get a route to London and base I5. But if it starts OR14 with just one train the Receiver will move its credit focus credit to new trains. Instead of basing I5 it would move its SP to G4 expecting to promote the station(s) it uses most and place a base when it would increase revenue.
