Graham 1st Thanks to Rob and the players for the game. It featured several changes of Directorship and interesting track.

Congratulations to Graham on winning this truncated game and also to George for finishing in second place.

The result of this game was decided very early in the game. The first critical point occurred when Graham started the GW and Mike chose **not** to take it from him. However, the result was decided in OR2 when the CPR purchased a 3-train rather than Andy's NSFBC private company. Graham and George then cut a deal which gave them the first two places and relegated Andy to last place.

Since I had fifth choice for a new company, I decided to experiment by starting the CV rather than the normal CA. The CV is a good company for constructing a Diesel route for the CGR, but it takes too long to develop to be a sensible initial company. Given that three places had already been determined by earlier actions, I was fortunate to finish in third place just ahead of Mike. Finally, apologies to Andy for preventing him from going bankrupt after his careful preparation.

Mike 4th My initial plan was to not have the GT go into the CGR, so I restrained myself from taking loans every OR. Unfortunately, this had the affect of leaving me on the tail end of the technology curve which also meant my cash flow was less than it needed to be for success. In the end I was reduced to dumping the GT to start a new RR. Unfortunately, due to my poor position in the SR turn order I did not get to start the very popular TGB and had to start the BBG instead. All in all, a crudy effort on my part from start to finish.

GM Apart from anything else, this game demonstrated the difficulty of the learning curve for a player when trying out a new 18xx title when the only option is to play against more experienced opponents. The advantage of such games played in a 'zine or equivalent is that lessons can be learnt more readily than when playing face to face (where the pace and lack of review mechanism make perception of what happened/went wrong harder). Andy is a good player but was experimenting with 1856.

Personally the thought of sitting down at a con and playing an 18xx title that was new to me with players that would inevitably be not only well-versed in the title, but also very good at it, is not appealing - unless I was prepared to follow it up with other learning games. One option is to pick up on a new title as it emerges and get mutual learning games going with a local group. Of course there is always the option of playing games solo and having each player try stuff - but I would find it hard to make that investment when so many other "more immediate return" gaming opportunities are available everywhere I look. So there.
