Thanks to Rob for running this game. Round 8 effectively knocked four players out of contention when the Scientist and three Orbital Labs went for a song (57-40=17, 56, 55 and 52 respectively) because only one player (me) had a significant amount of money. I haven't reviewed later rounds to see what subsequently happened, or what they might have done wrong, to cause Mick and Tony to fail to profit from this, but it allowed both Ian and I to build large incomes that proved decisive in the final stages of the game.

Ian P 2nd

I would like to thank Rob for the substantial time and effort he spent on moderating this game. The game went very smoothly.

Congratulations to Dane on achieving his excellent victory. Ignoring the weird M14 game, a total of 91 VPs after sixteen rounds was a brilliant result.

The first three places were determined in Round 8 when Dane, Ian and Mick purchased the three Orbital Labs. Although I did **not** realise it at the time, first place was determined in Round 9. There were zero Orbital Labs, zero Laboratories and only one Scientists available in Round 9. I auctioned the Scientists with an initial bid of 71. Dane then bid 75 (with an expected holding of 93). Inexplicably, Tony passed with an expected holding of 58 (but an actual holding of 50) and a discount of 40 on a Scientists. Logically, Tony had an automatic bid of 90 on the Scientists. In very rare circumstances, it might be reasonable to purchase a Warehouse when holding four Data Libraries. Owning either a Scientists or a Laboratory permits a player to buy either a new chemicals factory or a research factory. After an unfortunate accident, Tony ended up with two pointless Warehouses. If Tony had requested a mega water card, he might have won the auction for the Scientists. Failing that, he could have purchased a water factory or an ugly ore factory to avoid discarding cards. Purchasing a Scientists in Round 9 allowed Dane to buy a total of four new chemicals factories during Rounds 10 to 13. With substantial production but limited VPs, Dane purchased a magical three Moon Bases in Rounds 14 to 16. Despite holding cards worth over 200 in both Rounds 14 & 15, I was unable to purchase a Moon Base in either round. I was pleased to finish within four VPs of Dane at the end of the game.

Given that David Smith started the game with poor cards, he did well to finish as the Best of the Rest in fourth place.

Tony S 5th

Council for the Defence pleads Not Guilty to the accusation of Deliberate Match Fixing but Guilty to the lesser crime of Culpable Ignorance.

Having completed 2 (or maybe 3) games of postal Outpost at the time of the offence, I was (am) still very much in the learning mode of the game, especially the blind bidding and alternative order writing. Hindsight is 20/20 vision and I did bid on Scientists but only up to 70 which was below the start price. As there were then still 3 more Scientists to be auctioned, I didn't feel the need to overpay at that stage as I had plans of my own. That may have been an erroneous thought, but it's all a learning curve and everyone has their own game plan and perhaps not all of us have the computer brain needed to work out who would win in 4 turns time. The incident with the warehouses caused great trauma; the Appropriations Manager was subsequently shot.

Anyway, I shall continue bumbling along. Maybe it is not advisable for an experienced player to base his own game-plan on the premise that everyone else will act logically as he sees it. Plan in some random chance factors to cover for incompetence ☺.

As so we conclude with George the clear winner. Any comments received will be printed next time.
