In gig news that most of you can very safely ignore I have just had two great Fridays. On the 14<sup>th</sup> I saw Garbage play a warm-up/dress rehearsal gig at the Cambridge Junction. Just amazing to see them in such a compact venue - it was easy to be near them and within “striking distance” of Shirley as she prowled the stage. They were all on great form and the next day they were headliners at the Isle Of Wight Festival. Garbage had all the crew and wagon loads of gear needed for their show and for “star protection”.

In complete contrast, when I saw Jace Everett with Dan Cohen on the 21<sup>st</sup>, they arrived in a cab and carried all their gear in in one go. They played at The Slaughtered Lamb in Clerkenwell in a small lounge like basement where we sat in comfort within reach of the stage. It felt like a gathering of friends as the pair mingled and then got up to play a great set (as per usual) with excellent commentary on English motorways and M&S sandwiches.

The fact that the hex numbering increases northwards up the map seems to be counter-intuitive. Also ... remember that the dark blue lines indicate impassable estuaries.
