Ian's analytical skills were never in doubt and he created a good track record in his 1856 & Outpost games here evidencing both "perspiration" and "inspiration". He always responded to any mathematical diversions that I included to fill up space on the front page. Ian finished a close second in the Outpost game that concluded last time and won the 1856 that finished this time. Capable until the end.

Dane 1st Winning the Orbital Lab auction in R9, perhaps thanks to above-average cards, alleviated my warehousing issues. Having then bought Robots in R10, I planned to get a Laboratory as soon as possible, but unfortunately in the subsequent rounds I had no control over the order in which cards were auctioned. Consequently in R12 and R13 I felt compelled to bid for various other things when they were auctioned lest I get outbid for the Laboratory that would presumably be auctioned later, though in R12 it wasn't. Thus I bought a further two Orbital Labs before finally getting the desired Laboratory in R14, just as the phase broke. I ignored the big cards in R15, choosing to ramp up my income substantially instead. That allowed me to win MB auctions in the final two rounds.
